Welcome To The River Nene

The River Nene is an important regional navigation rising at sources near Badby, Naseby and Yelvertoft, and becomes navigable at Northampton where these tributaries combine. Navigation starts at the junction with the Northampton Arm of the Grand Union Canal near Cotton End Lock and extends 147 km (91 miles) to the sea.

Originally a commercial navigation it is now used almost entirely for recreation. Flowing through Northamptonshire, Cambridgeshire, Lincolnshire and bordering Norfolk, the Nene gives contrasting views of eastern England.

In Northamptonshire the river meanders through farmland and the industry of Northampton, Wellingborough and Irthlingborough. Further downstream there are numerous traditional stone villages and quiet country churches for which the 'county of squires and spires' is famous.

Peterborough dominates the route through Cambridgeshire with the city's cathedral visible on the horizon across great stretches of fenland. The Nene was tidal to Peterborough until the construction of a tidal lock and sluice at the Dog in a Doublet in

The tidal Nene flows through parts of Lincolnshire to the once bustling port of Wisbech, with its Dutch style waterfront architecture, and on to the port at Sutton Bridge. The final leg enters the Wash between two towers known as "the lighthouses".

Navigation Authority

The Environment Agency is the navigation authority for the River Nene from Northampton to Bevis Hall just upstream of Wisbech.

Speed Limits

A speed limit of 7mph (11.kmph) applies throughout the navigation. Please navigate with care at all times for your own safety as well as to protect others, the water environment and wildlife.

Locks

There are 38 locks between Northampton and Peterborough. Typical lock dimensions are 26m long and 4.6m wide. Most of these locks have pointing doors at the upstream end and vertical guillotine gates at the lower end. Environment Agency navigation keys are required to operate them.

A windlass to fit 2.6cm square is required to operate the paddles. Navigation keys and windlasses can be purchased by licensed users at the following locations on the River Nene: Gayton Marina, Northampton Marina, Peterborough Boating Centre and Dog in a Doublet Lock.



The river is tidal for 45kms (28 miles) downstream of the Dog in a Doublet Lock. Registered craft can pass through the lock every day from 07.30am until official sunset time and must telephone (01733) 202219 to arrange passage in advance of arrival. Warning: There is a strong run on the flood and ebb tides in Wisbech and craft should

Bridges along the River Nene have a headroom of 2.70 metres or more when the river levels are normal, with the following exceptions. Always read the inverted gauge boards located at bridge to decide whether or not your boat can pass safely underneath.

Freedom Bridge

Boats must not be moored within 36 metres (118ft) of any lock, sluice, weir or water intake except when navigating through a lock. In some cases such as Dog in a Doublet Lock, Bedford Road Sluice (Northampton) and Weston Favell (Northampton), mooring is prohibited for 100 metres (328ft) on both sides of the structure. Please note that the landing stages at either side of a lock are not to be used for overnight mooring.

Vessel Registration

All vessels kept, used or let for hire on the river must be registered with The Environment Agency or on a Canal and River Trust (CRT) Gold Licence. (A CRT standard river and canal licence does not cover you on our waterways). If applicable your vessel will also need a valid Boat Safety Scheme Certificate and insurance along with the appropriate registration

If you are a member of the Canoe England or British Rowing, you may find that your membership provides you with automatic registration.



River Advice for Boaters

In times of high flow and during floods, some locks on the river are 'reversed'. An operation which closes the affected locks to navigation. We advise boat users that the locks are 'reversed' and we strongly advise against attempting to navigate. When Strong Stream Advice is in force, signs and warning lights along the length of the river are activated. A number of boat clubs and marinas also display red flags to warn river users Strong Stream Advice has been issued.





The first experience that visiting boat users will have of navigation on the River Nene is likely to be at Northampton, after passage from the canal system. Passage from the Grand Union Canal is via the Northampton Arm, which runs for 4 miles from the canal at Gayton, through 17 locks to Northampton. In Northampton moorings are available at Northampton Marina.

Northampton Washlands

During times of flood, navigation may be closed by barrage gates located near Abington and Weston Favell Locks. The lights and sirens on each of the barrage gate give warning that the gates are moving. In the unlikely event that the lights and sirens are in operation, NO ATTEMPT SHOULD BE MADE TO NAVIGATE. If you are within the Washlands when in operation an emergency mooring facility is provided. This mooring should be used only for emergencies between October and April and can be used as a normal visitor mooring during the boating season.
